A new Cultural Revolution in China?: This year is the 50th anniversary of Chairman Mao's Cultural Revolution and it seems there is now a new cultural revolution. Not only is President Xi purging the Chinese Communist Party (CCP) of all opposition, he is reviving Maoist ideology and strengthening CCP control over everything, including the Church. President Xi's campaign to force the Church into the service of the CCP is focused at present on the southern coastal province of Zhejiang. For the first time since Mao's Cultural Revolution of 1966-1977 the CCP is targeting official, CCP-approved churches. In recent weeks two of Zhejiang's most senior registered pastors have been imprisoned, essentially for criticising CCP policy and resisting CCP orders. The situation in China is extremely serious. Please pray for China and its Church.

A Prayer at the Beginning of the Day.

We find ourselves at the beginning of another day. We do not know what it will bring. Please, help us to be ready for whatever it may be.

#### Asylum Seeker Support

The Asylum Seeker Support Group would like to thank the congregation for their donations towards the support of asylum seekers living lawfully in the community while awaiting an outcome to their application for permanent residency. During 2015 we were able to assist with over 150 items of food, 30 household cleaning agents, 46 items of bedlinen, 20 items of bath linen, 287 items of clothing, and 41 sundry items. There is a continued need for these contributions. The labelled boxes in the foyer (under the library shelves) tell you what the specific needs are (particularly in food lines), so check them out and remember them when you go shopping! Items contributed are given to the Dandenong Asylum Seeker Centre, and to the Asylum Seeker Project run by our Uniting Church agency, Lentara.

#### The Christian Church in the World

**Pray for Sudan and its Church**: Christian activist Talahon Ratta, a member of the Sudan Presbyterian Evangelical Church, was arrested on 14 December 2015. Detained without charge, reportedly he has been questioned extensively about his relationship with a foreign missionary, although Christians suspect he was targeted because he protested against government persecution of the Khartoum Bahri Evangelical Church. On 18 December 2015 authorities from the National Intelligence and Security Services arrested Rev Kowa Shamaal at his home in Khartoum Bahri and Rev Hassan Abdelrahim at his home in Omdurman. Shamaal is the head of mission at the Sudan Church of Christ (SCOC) and Adbedlrahim is vice-moderator. Both had objected to government demolitions of SCOC church properties. Kowa Shamaal has been conditionally released but Hassan Abdelrahim remains detained. Please pray for Sudan and its Church.

Dear Friends,

Mark 12.36: 'Abba! Father!' The cry of the Spirit

These words reflect feeling, awareness of the love and the reliability of God. These words are words of the Spirit. There is a strengthening of courage which is required to go forward and face the future in the knowledge of the graciousness and nearness of God.

As we read this passage from Mark we imagine Jesus falling to the ground and praying. He prays alone and then returns to find his disciples asleep. His message is clear.
