1. Donate items for the Silent Auction

The silent auction is an important part of the fundraising for charity, contributing over \$4000 in 2014 and around \$3000 last year. The goods auctioned are all donated, largely by local traders, but **an important contribution is donations by congregation members**. Last year, 8 congregation members contributed 15 items (or more if individual donations which were combined are counted) and we hope for more this year.

Items donated last year - **all brand new** - included cosmetics (probably gifts of the wrong perfume etc), Computer games, teddy bears, handbags of various sorts, Baby basket kits, head phones, an indoor compositor and several wood carvings. A wide range isn't it? - Just about anything which is saleable can be auctioned .

We have occasionally sold items, particularly bicycles, in an "as new" condition. We reserve the right to banish items which don't quite meet our standard "as new" to trash & treasure.

So please sort out your contribution and advise Cliff Baker (9802 8990) of what you are able to give to help us. As the preparation of documents for the auction takes some time, it would be appreciated if this can be done as soon as possible

2. SIGN UP to be part of the team

We need:

- **People who are fit, to assist in fetching and assembling tables and booths** and collecting donated items to be sold (trailers also needed). Could you get a day off work to be part of a friendly team? (set up on Thursday and Friday, cleanup on Saturday and final returns on Monday).
- **Everybody to sort and arrange items for sale on the Friday.** This is a mammoth task, and extra help is needed, particularly for the Trash and Treasure and Used Clothing.
- **Staff for the various stalls on Saturday.** Can you spare an hour (or more)?

Sign-up sheets will be available shortly, but please consider making yourself available on some or all of these days.

3. Collect and Fill a \$2 Box

Empty boxes are **available today**. Please take one (or more), fill it with goodies and return filled boxes to the specially marked box in the foyer. It will be sold for \$2, with children in particular enjoying selecting their purchase.

Please note that sweets must be wrapped, and not past their use-by dates. **NO NUT PRODUCTS PLEASE.**



4. A Treat for your garden - "Beeac Premium"

Order bags of "Beeac Premium" sheep manure, direct from the farms of our Beeac friends. Bags are \$8 each, and supply is limited. To be sure of getting your bag, place your order on the list on the office counter. Collect and pay on fete day.
