Dear Friends,

If you have been able to join our services of worship lately, or the online/face-to-face Bible study, you will know that the ministry team are working with the theme 'Full to the Brim' over Lent and Easter. At first glance this didn't sound like a Lent theme. Lent is thought of as a time of discipline, prayer, fasting, giving to the poor and reflecting on who we are before God.

'Full to the Brim' has invited us to reflect on the abundant life-giving grace of God. The gospel readings during Lent remind us of this grace – the prodigal son who returns home, the fruitless fig tree given more care and attention in the hope of bearing fruit, Jesus as a mother hen who offers fierce love and protection, and oil lovingly and generously poured over Jesus' feet as an act of devotion. These powerful images remind us of a giving God, a gracious God, a loving God.

Jesus lived a full life clearly exhibiting God's grace and love. Jesus did this in the way that he noticed people on the edges; he welcomed and included people; he offered healing; he taught and helped people to see the world differently, to see the radical nature of God's kingdom, and to see the inclusive nature of the people of God. Sometimes Jesus' teaching and life might make us feel uncomfortable. We want to be welcoming and inclusive, but do we have to be so welcoming and inclusive? We are urged to step out of our comfort zones. It might mean that we have to change our thinking and even change some of our ways. Jesus was prepared to rock the boat, to challenge practices and ways of doing things in order to be more open to include and embrace the other. Jesus wanted to give life rather than deny life.

From Monday to Thursday in Holy Week, there will be an art installation in the Chapel (Room 1), which will be open between 9am-3.30pm each day. You are invited to journey through at your own pace.
