
UCAF - Tuesday 7th May

During the month of April, the Outreach and Social Justice Missional group are running a Food drive for The Refugee Resource Hub and encourage your support. The Refugee Resource Hub is in the heart of Dandenong, and is powered by the Asylum Seeker Resource Centre, as a place of welcome, community and support for people seeking asylum and refugees living in Melbourne's Southeast. Giving food is the most immediate and tangible way to support people seeking asylum. Every donation makes a difference. Urgently needed items: Tuna in oil, Tomato paste, Basmati rice, Coconut cream/milk, Honey, Full cream UHT milk 1L, Instant coffee, Black tea bags, Biscuits, Tinned vegetables, Oil 750ml-1L, Dried legumes (chickpeas, split red lentils, yellow split peas), Spices (cumin, turmeric, chilli, coriander), Laundry powder/liquid 1kg pack, Unsalted dried nuts, Dried fruit.

Food drive donations can be placed in the marked coloured bin by the office door throughout April, final day for donations is **Sunday May 5th**.

With winter fast approaching, the Outreach and Social Justice Missional Group is planning a project to provide knitted items for KOGO (Knit One Give One).



Help us spread the warmth

8-ply Garter Stitch Scarf



Materials

- 5 x 50gm balls 8ply yarn
- Pair 4mm needles

Cast on 42 stitches knit in garter stitch until scarf is approx. 176cm (70") in length.

If you would prefer a slightly shorter version, use just 4 x 50gm balls of 8-ply yarn which will give you a scarf of approx. 150cm (59") in length.

Cast off & darn in ends.
